

This two-week series focuses on The Meeting House's new Go campaign. The campaign's purpose is to introduce spiritually curious people to the Jesus-centred life through a movement of Jesus-centred churches. To translate that for a youth setting, Go will help our friends learn about Jesus and welcome them wholeheartedly into the community.

HANGOUT

1. Discuss:
 - When someone tells you to go and do something, how do you usually feel? Why?
 - Does knowing that Jesus would like you to go and do something make you feel any differently? Why or why not?

HEAR

2. Look up Acts 10 together.
3. Read verses 1-8, then discuss:
 - God loved Cornelius and accepted his good deeds as worship. Why, then, do you think he brought Peter into the story?
 - Why do you think God wanted Cornelius to hear the Gospel?
4. Read verses 9-23, then discuss: Peter has this bizarre vision when he's hungry. What do you think about God using our natural human cravings to meet us and teach us?
5. Read verses 24-29, then discuss: Peter was hesitant to receive hospitality from a Roman. Is there anyone you'd hesitate to show hospitality to or receive it from? Why?
6. Read verses 30-48, then discuss: What was Cornelius's response to Peter?
7. Discuss: In Acts 10:34-43, Peter explains the Gospel (the Good News). Based on these ideas, how would you share the Good News with your friends? What would make sense to them?

HUDDLE

8. Discuss:
 - What's one thing you could do to nudge yourself toward talking about Jesus with a spiritually curious person in your life?
 - What might you say to them?
9. Point out that asking questions about what others believe can be a great way to start the conversation!
10. Pray for the spiritually curious people in your lives and for one another.
